
CLASSROOM

Classrooms provide a unique challenge regardless of whether different groups of students will be present or whether the same group will spend the full day in the same room. "Shared" classrooms need to be serviced between periods while general classrooms may only need service at the beginning of the day.





PARTNERS IN PROTECTION

TRIPLE S

HIGH-TOUCH SURFACES

Classrooms have a wide variety of surfaces that may present considerable risk and need attention at frequent intervals over the course of the day.



Desk and Chairs

Need to be wiped or cleaned/ sanitized/ disinfected prior to first use by a student.



Computers

All computer equipment should be wiped prior to use; consider keyboard covers to reduce risk.



Light Switches

Leave lights on all day or assign a single individual to turn on/off the light.



Teacher's Desk

The teacher is responsible for taking care of their own desk at the start of the school day.

COLLABORATIVE CLEANING

Schools have several options to ensure surfaces and items are effectively serviced. All students may be asked to wipe or otherwise take care of their own area or a "team" of students can be selected to take care of the classroom. If the school is hesitant to allow students to play a role, the teacher can provide service to the entire classroom.

ADDITIONAL PROTOCOLS

- If there is a sink present in the room, mandatory hand washing during a class session is recommended.
- Wipes should be available at the front of the room for use by students and/or teachers.
- Designate one teacher or staff member per classroom to open/close all cabinets to reduce risk.
- If school policy allows, leave doors open. Otherwise, assign an individual to open and close the door.
- Limit the sharing of items, including science/music equipment, computers, tablets, and common tools.
