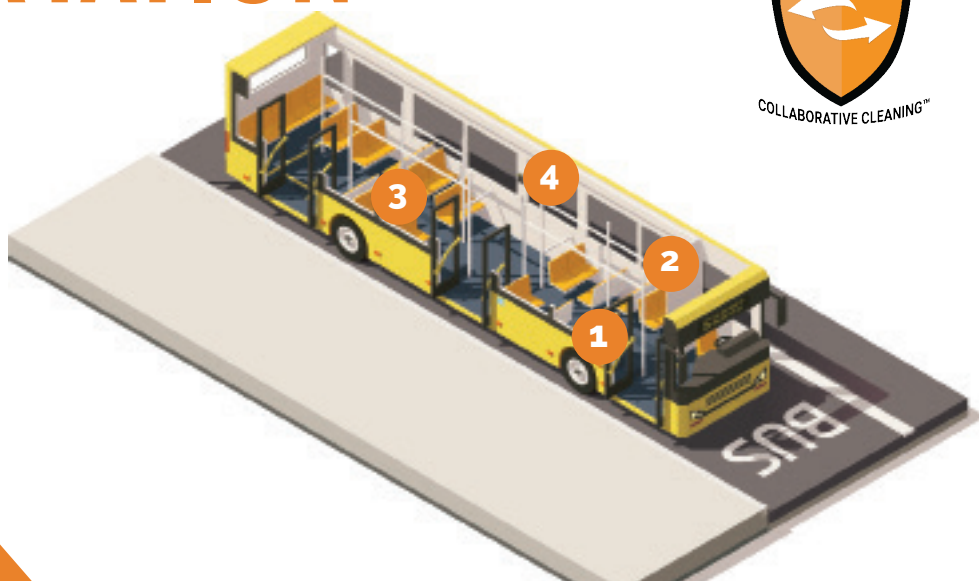


TRANSPORTATION



Student transportation presents several concerns: the need to service commonly touched surfaces, social distancing, safety, and airflow. Schools will have to work closely with third-party transportation providers to ensure best practice protocols are followed. Health risks must also be minimized on school-owned vehicles such as student vans.

STOP THE SPREAD

Schools will need to team up with transportation providers to reduce risk. Among the key protocols that will need to be implemented -



Hand Sanitizer

Hand sanitizer should be available at the front of the bus and students should sanitize hands when boarding and exiting.



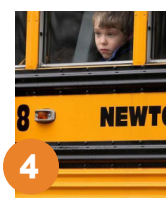
Wipes

Wipes should be available for use and seats should be wiped prior to each trip.



Distance Seating

Follow CDC and local guidance when it comes to implementing social distancing on buses and school vehicles.



Ventilation

Bus and other vehicle windows should be kept open whenever possible to increase ventilation.

HAND HYGIENE

Focusing on hand hygiene will be crucial to efforts to minimize the risk for both students and drivers. Either a hand sanitizer dispenser should be available at the front or immediately outside of the vehicle or staff members should be positioned provide students with sanitizer as they board.

KEY SURFACES

- School vehicle seats need to be wiped prior to each trip by a designated representative.
- Bus windows should be cleaned each evening. Caution riders not to touch the windows.
- Vehicle handrails need to be wiped/disinfected prior to each trip.
- Buses and vehicles with seat belts should implement a protocol to ensure risks are minimized.
- Only the driver should be permitted to touch the steering wheel and door opening lever.
